I support the Pregnancy Compassion Act that directs public funds to qualified Pregnancy Resource Centers (PRCs) as a way of assisting women with unplanned pregnancies who need help with the birth and care of their child.

I support the recently passed Abortion Coercion Act that makes it a crime to coerce someone into having an abortion.

I support the Born Alive Infant Protection Act which ensures that a child born alive, even after a botched abortion, will receive care like any other child.

I support Abortion Pill Reversal and Right to Know Legislation. Women seeking a chemical abortion should be informed by the abortionist that a qualified health professional may administer progesterone to the woman to counteract the effects of the chemical abortion drug and possibly save her preborn child.

I support the recently passed Kansas Life Affirming Tax Package that gave PRCs a sales tax exemption on supplies they use to help women with unplanned pregnancies, a 70% tax credit for donations to PRCs, and adoption-friendly savings accounts and tax credits for families seeking to adopt.
