RE: **WRITTEN PROPONENT FOR SB 520** Creating the crime of interference with the conduct of a religious assembly, providing criminal penalties therefore and providing for a civil cause of action for damages

The Kansas Catholic Conference is the public policy voice of the Catholic Church in Kansas. We welcome the opportunity to offer our support for SB 520.

Various voices of leadership from the Catholic Church in Kansas and across the United States have expressed concern over some of the immigration enforcement methods carried out in certain parts of the country, including Minnesota. We support peaceful, lawful civil disobedience. Disrupting a church service crosses this line.

If passed into law, SB 520 creates the crime of "interference with the conduct of a religious assembly," including criminal penalties and a pathway to civil damages. The Kansas Catholic Conference sees this as a Religious Liberty issue, and we support this legislation. It will give Kansas prosecutors the tools they need to address such issues without hoping for federal intervention.

Current Kansas law regarding criminal desecration (KSA 21-6205) addresses damaging, defacing or destroying a place of worship. SB 520 will address that issue, in addition to the issue of disrupting or interfering with a religious assembly. Greater clarity and higher penalty levels are needed to match the severity of the crime. The civil penalties and cause for action by victims will increase the deterrent effect.

Regarding unwanted and unwelcome entry into Catholic Churches, we also reaffirm our opposition for law enforcement officers to enter places of worship without prior permission—including Catholic Churches—as well as Catholic schools, social service agencies and the like for purposes of making arrests or detentions.

This too, is also an issue of Religious Liberty we will defend.
